CDA Unit 5: Ensuring Developmentally Appropriate Practice CC345

Hours: In Class 25 Clinical Total 25

Description

Part of the 10 class, 150 hour series, in the Pathway to the Childcare Development Associate, CDA, national credentialing program. Unit 5 focuses on the importance of providing developmentally appropriate practices, interesting to children, allowing hands-on learning. It also focuses on how to adapt those learning activities for children with special needs.

Prerequisites

None. Classes in this program series do not need to be taken in any sequence except that Unit 10 must be taken after all the other classes have been completed successfully.

Describe nine learning activities for young children that cover the areas of science sensory, language, literacy, creative, fine motor, gross motor, self-concept, emotional, social and math

Develop a reflective statement for three of the nine learning experience
