Hours: In Class 8 Clinical Total 8

Description

The goal of restorative care is to assist the client to attain or maintain their highest level of functioning. In this eight hour class, the nursing assistant will learn to train a client in self care according to the client's ability to perform. It will include six hours of theory and two hours of lab.

Must be a Certified Nurse Assistant, Developmentally Disabled Certified Assistant, or HHA/CNA with at least 6 months work experience

Learning Objectives

1. Develop understanding of interdisciplinary team as well as the role and function of the restorative aide as a part of that team.
2. Explain principles of restorative care and how it applies to the client.
3. Identify the use of assistive devices utilized in delivering restorative care.
4. Provide accurate documentation as it pertains to restorative care.
5. Demonstrate competency with skills check-offs in the lab setting.
